# Sizing

To fit: Adult small/medium

### Finished brim circumference: 21"

To make the hat smaller or larger, work fewer or more increase rounds before working even (and adjust the number of work-even rounds). If you'd like to learn more about sizing hats of all sorts, you'll enjoy my class, **Crochet in the Round: Basics & Beyond**!

# **Materials**

Yarn: Worsted weight, approx. 100 yards MC and 12 yards CC. Shown here in: Spud & Chloe Sweater (55% superwash wool/45% certified organic cotton; 160 yds per 100 g), half skein in Beluga (MC) and about 12 yards in Turtle (CC).

Hook: 5mm (US H/8).

# Gauge

13.5 stitches and about 8 rows = 4" in double crochet.



When the first chilly weather hits, here's your go-to hat project for keeping warm straight away! It's such a quick project, you'll be able to outfit everyone you know in no time flat.

# Pattern

Begin with an adjustable ring.

**Round 1**: Ch 3 (tch counts as first dc here and throughout), work 11 dc into ring, sl st in top of tch to join, tighten ring - 12 dc total.

**Round 2**: Ch 3, skip same stitch as tch, 2 dc in each stitch around, dc in same stitch as tch, sl st in top of tch to join - 24 dc.

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# **Abbreviations**

- CC = contrast colour
- ch = chain
- dc = double crochet
- MC = main colour
- rep = repeat
- sl st = slip stitch
- tch = turning chain

**Round 4**: Ch 3, dc in next stitch, 2 dc in next stitch, \*dc in each of next 2 stitches, 2 dc in next stitch; rep from \* around, sl st in top of tch to join – 48 dc.

**Round 5**: Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 stitches, 2 dc in next stitch, \*dc in each of next 3 stitches, 2 dc in next stitch; rep from \* around, sl st in top of tch to join –

60 dc.

**Round 6**: Ch 3, dc in each of next 3 stitches, 2 dc in next stitch, \*dc in each of next 4 stitches, 2 dc in next stitch; rep from \* around, sl st in top of tch to join -72 dc.

# Work Even

**Rounds 7-10**: Work even, switch to CC at the end of Round 10.

**Round 11**: Work even in CC, switch to MC at the end of the round.

**Round 12**: Work even in MC, switch to CC at the end of the round.

**Round 13**: Work even in CC, switch to MC at the end of the round.

**Round 14**: Work even in MC, switch to CC at the end of the round (cut MC, leaving an 8" tail).

# brim

**Rounds 15-19**: With CC, ch 1, sc in each stitch around, sl st in first sc to join.

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Fasten off and weave in loose ends.

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
